Teri Talk - December 2023

There is a story that was written to help understand why we "wait with anticipation" during the Advent season to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Advent and Christmas are the time for mystery, the time for those delightful things we do not fully understand. We use music and poetry and stories to get at those deeper truths to let their light shine on us. It is a story you may have heard before as it was one that Paul Harvey, an ABC Radio news commentator who frequently told this story around Christmas time in his *and now for "The Rest of the Story"* broadcast segments. The original author is unknown. It's a story which might help us get at the deeper meaning of this time of year and the thing we call the incarnation.

Once Upon a time, there was a man to whom Christmas did not make much sense. He had a rather "humbug" attitude towards it all. He might even have been heard to say, "Christmas is for the birds." Now, he wasn't a bad man. He was a good man. He provided well for his family, even beyond the necessities. He dealt honestly and fairly with everyone with whom he did business. He was kind and compassionate towards everyone he came into contact with on a day-to-day basis. It was just that he could not accept what he could not understand. And that meant he could not accept these things the church said about the incarnation, about how it was when God became a man.

He was honest about it. He could be heard saying to his wife, "I really hope I don't offend you. I certainly don't mean to hurt your feelings." You see, she was a person of faith and attended church regularly. But he said, "I can't go to church with you. It would be hypocritical. I would be pretending to believe something and accept something I simply cannot pretend to believe." And so the family went to church and he stayed home. That's how it was one Christmas Eve. The family was getting ready to go to the late evening service at the church and he said, "I hope you'll understand. I feel like a hypocrite going with you so I'm going to stay at home. But I will wait up until you are back." No sooner had the family car pulled out of the driveway and disappeared down the street than he noticed the wind coming up. Glancing outside he saw that a winter storm was setting in and the snow flurries were already beginning to blow, and the snow was beginning to drift across the lawn. Taking his pipe in hand and settling into his easy chair, he sat by the fireside to read the evening paper.

Suddenly there was a noise that startled him. It was a "thump" against the front window of the house. He rushed to the door but, looking out, saw no one. Instead, he noticed a flock of tiny birds flopping about in the snow. They were cold and freezing, caught by the storm, and they had simply tried to fly through his window to find warmth and safety. He said to himself, "*I can't let these creatures freeze to death, but what am I to do*?" He thought about it for a moment, and then remembered that outback there was a small barn in which they stabled the children's pony. He knew it would be warm and comfortable there, and it would certainly be a place of refuge for the birds. He went immediately to put on his coat and boots, his gloves, hat, and muffler, and went out and opened the doors to the barn. He turned on the lights and turned up the heat and stood back to watch, hoping the birds would see what he meant for them to do. But they didn't. Instead, they just continued to fly around aimlessly in the storm, and flop about on the ground.

"*Ah*," He thought, "*I can attract them with food*!" So, he rushed back into the house, got some breadcrumbs from the kitchen and went back out to sprinkle them across the yard from the place where the birds were to the entrance of the barn, hoping they would follow the trail of food until they found the safety, he'd provided for them. But no, they didn't understand. They didn't follow the food crumbs either. Finally, in other desperation he thought perhaps he could "shoo" them in and so he began to wave his arms and to run around in the yard. It just seemed as if the birds thought that he was some kind of strange creature, making all that commotion. They were more frightened by him than anything else. Suddenly he came to the end of his rope and realized there wasn't anything he could do to save the birds, <u>unless</u> it was possible for him to become a bird himself.... And in that moment, he heard the church bells ringing. He fell to his knees in the snow and, looking up, he prayed, "*Now I understand. Now I know why you did what you did!*" Amen.

May the mystery of God's love be a blessing in your life.
