Teri Talk - July 2023

I had the opportunity to spend time with the 425 Youth Group on their Ark Encounter trip. This is an amazing group of kids to hang out with! They are thoughtful, kind, they share and don't try to "have their own way," they look out for each other, check in with each other, and make sure everyone is included. They think and talk about things they can do to serve others. They also do normal teenage stuff, like staying glued to their phones and having a four-night long slumber party, including staying up way too late having fun.

During this trip we traveled through five states including Kansas. We kicked off the trip with a visit to the Gateway Arch in St. Louis, Missouri and most of the group traveled to the top of the Arch to see the view. There are about 8 "cars" that act as elevators to ride to the top of the Arch, each with five seats. One of the kids described the elevator cars as getting into a "washing machine." We spent time in the Museum on site and took a one-hour ferry ride on the *Tom Sawyer* up the Mississippi River.

Day three of the trip was the tour of the Ark Encounter in Williamstown, Kentucky and the Creation Museum about 45 minutes north in Petersburg, KY. The developers built a replica of Noah's Ark to scale using interpreted measurements based on the story in Genesis. The representation of the ark is a visual experience of understanding how massive this boat was. Why isn't it called Noah's Boat or Ship? It was meant to float on the water and there are numerous Biblical references to boats and ships, why in this story is it referred to as an ark? An ark is not only a boat, but also a place of protection, safety, and refuge.

What the Ark Encounter offers is a way of bringing the story to life. How the interior of the ark could have been designed for living quarters for the human beings and containment of the animals. How plants could be grown and maintained for food, how fresh water could be obtained, filtered, and stored, and waste management. This vision of the story of Noah was produced out of modern minds but the developers tried to give a faithful and realistic experience based on what would have been available in that time period. Whether or not the vision of the developers of the Ark Encounter is an accurate depiction or representation of the story of Noah, the experience it provides opens up the imagination, focuses on the greatness of God and how God works through us to accomplish the seemingly impossible.

May these youth be blessed with a Holy Imagination and inspired by how much bigger God is than our ability to understand and continue to grow in their faith.

2023 St. John Lutheran Church Back-to-School Giveaway Thursday and Friday, August 10 & 11

The 2023 St. John Lutheran Church Back-to-School Giveaway is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, August 10 and 11.

 Russell County area students (preschool through senior high school) eligible for free- and reduced-lunches may choose from gently used clothing and shoes, and will receive a package of new socks and undergarments. Each student is limited to ten items (in addition to new socks and undergarments) on Thursday, but may return on Friday to select additional items with no restrictions.

Donations of gently used clothing and shoes, and new socks and undergarments <u>in all</u> <u>sizes</u> (preschool through high school) are greatly appreciated and will be collected through Thursday, August 3. Gently used clothing and shoes may be placed in the box under the coat rack in the basement. New socks and undergarments may be delivered to the church office.

- Personal care items (shampoo, deodorant, toothbrushes/toothpaste, combs/brushes, body wash, lip balm, nail clippers/emery boards, lotion, small hand sanitizer, barrettes/hair ties, etc.) will be made available to students while supplies last. Each student may choose up to five items on Thursday, and on Friday all remaining items will be available on a first come, first serve basis. New personal care items may be placed in the boxes under the coat rack in the main hall.
- A limited number of new school supplies will be available for students in junior and senior high. These basic items may include spiral notebooks, highlighters, USB drives, ink pens (red, blue, and black), pencils and erasers. New school supplies may be delivered to the church office.
- Monetary donations are greatly appreciated and will be used to purchase items not received through donations. Monetary donations may be delivered to the church office.

All donations remaining after Friday, August 11 will be sorted and donated to the Orphan Grain Train, the Salina Rescue Mission, and other area ministries. New socks and undergarments will be stored until next year.

God's love for us is boundless - Christ has given his life for us - we have been given the gift of the holy spirit! Today, as I am writing my newsletter article I was visiting my wife who is recuperating from surgery. as a temporary resident at Wheatland Skilled Nursing Center. I tried to inspire her to continue to progress and improve. As I was leaving I was thinking about how *unfair* it was that I had to leave Deb at Wheatland and go home without her.

I have come to know many of the residents through regular visits and Care Center Worship every month or so. As I was leaving I saw Doug - one of the long-term residents. I stopped for a chat and he said "Now, John. You behave yourself!" Of course I said I couldn't promise anything. I asked how things were going for him.

He told me he will be losing his remaining foot to diabetes in the near future. I gave him my sympathy and promise of prayers for quick healing. In my heart I was overcome with emotion - I was angry, and it wasn't even happening to me. How could Doug *not* be angry?

I received an Epiphany moment from Doug - even as he faced his troubles, he simply said to me, "God has done so much for me already! I never forget to thank him!" I quickly patted him on the shoulder, told him he would be in my prayers, and made my way to the exit.

I was almost in tears - in spite of all of the complications and years he had been in Wheatland - Doug was thankful! He taught me something this morning. I had to hear from Doug what I should have recognized all along - God never leaves, He is always with us - good times and bad, times of struggle and times of joy. Doug's simple comments reminded me of the good news.

I pray, dear God, and thank your for everything you do in our lives. You keep us knowing that you are the God of hope. The God of eternal love. The God of mercy and the God of forgiveness. Life comes at us too fast and sometimes we forget the love you sent us in Jesus Christ who took our sins to the cross. We thank you today and every day, even when we need reminding during a talk with Doug. I pray that you keep Doug safe and heal him as you can. Hold us all in your heart and help us to be your servant. Amen.

We are given so much every day, but sometimes we have to stop and listen - to our family, our friends, the world around us - to understand the depth of your love. I will continue to be the child of God you teach us to be.


We Gather As One 5th Weekend Combined Service Saturday, July 29, 2023 6:00 pm ~ Chapel
