## Teri Talk - March 2024

We begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday, being marked with an ash cross as a reminder of our mortality; "you were made from dust and to dust you will return" (Gensis 3:19). Throughout scripture in the Old Testament are images of people physically demonstrating repentance and humility before God by dressing in sackcloth and covering themselves with ashes. It was an outward sign that something within them had changed, that they had turned around or away from offending God and asking for forgiveness. During the season of Lent, we follow Jesus' journey to the cross and his death. The cross always leads to death.

We have received another mark of the cross, one that promises life, not death. In baptism we are named and claimed as "*a child of God, sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever*" with oil. We hear the words:

You have been clothed in Christ. All who are baptized have put on Christ. Walk in the faith of Christ crucified and risen. Shine with the light of Christ. Through baptism you are named and claimed by God, entrusted with the good news of Jesus Christ, and strengthened to serve by the holy and life-giving Spirit.

There is no resurrection without the cross or death. There is no fulfillment of the promise of becoming a new creation or eternal life in God's love without death.

The traditional theme in Lent is repentance. If we are focusing on repentance through the traditions of fasting and prayer or giving something up during the Lenten season; our focus is on **ourselves**. What **I** am doing, why **I** am doing it, and hopefully how are these actions bringing **me** closer to God. What if during the season of Lent our focus was based in our baptismal promises:

to share with others the life-giving and sustaining good news of Jesus Christ and to step outside ourselves to serve others?

#### Parable of the Life Saving Station

On a dangerous seacoast where shipwrecks often occur there was once a crude little lifesaving station. The building was just a hut, and there was only one boat, but the few devoted members kept a constant watch over the sea, and with no thought of themselves went out day and night tirelessly searching for the lost. Many lives were saved by this wonderful little station, so that it became famous.

Some of those who were saved, and various others in the surrounding area, wanted to become associated with the station and give of their time, money, and effort to support its work. New boats were purchased, and new crews trained. The little lifesaving station grew.

Some of the members of the lifesaving station were unhappy that the building was so crude and poorly equipped. They felt that a more comfortable place should be provided as the first refuge for those saved from the sea. So, they replaced the emergency cots with beds and put better furniture in the enlarged building. Now the lifesaving station became a popular gathering place for its members, and they decorated it beautifully and furnished it exquisitely, because they used it as a sort of club. Fewer members were now interested in going to sea on lifesaving missions, so they hired lifeboat crews to do this work. The lifesaving theme still prevailed in this club's decoration, and there was a large, central symbol of a lifeboat in the room where the club meetings were held, and new members welcomed.

About this time a large ship was wrecked off the coast, and the hired crews brought in boatloads of cold, wet, and half-drowned people. They were dirty, some were sick, and the survivors were of many different races and ethnicities. The beautiful new club was in chaos with the mess made when the saved were brought in. So, the property committee immediately had a shower house built outside the club where victims of shipwrecks could be cleaned up before coming inside.

At the next meeting, there was a split in the club membership. Most of the members wanted to stop the club's lifesaving activities as being unpleasant and a hindrance to the normal social life of the club. Some members insisted upon lifesaving as their primary purpose and pointed out that they were still called a lifesaving station. But they were finally voted down and told that if they wanted to save the lives of all the various kinds of people who were shipwrecked in those waters, they could begin their own lifesaving station down the coast. So they did.

As the years went by, the newly established lifesaving station experienced the same changes that had occurred in the old. It evolved into a club, and yet another lifesaving station was founded. History continued to repeat itself, and if you visit that seacoast today, you will find numerous exclusive clubs all along the shoreline. Shipwrecks continue to be frequent in those waters, but most of the people drown!
