THE INTRODUCTION

P: Welcome to St. John Lutheran Church in the name of Jesus Christ, + the Savior of the world. Our purpose here today is to remember and honor the life of Dale Ehrlich and to express our love and our affection for a man who will be dearly missed.

No matter when or where death reaches us it should never find us unprepared because we know that dying is part of living. And it is here in the presence of death that our Christian faith provides us not only insight into the mystery of death, but it provides us with strength for the mastery of life, because Jesus taught us not only how to live but he also showed us through God's love that we can die with confidence. Just as Jesus comforted Martha with these words "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die" (John 11:25-26). Though in sorrow we are aching from his loss, our hearts can remember and rejoice in the memory of his life.

INVOCATION FOR THE GATHERED

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

P: Let us pray: Dear God, we do come to you with confidence today because we are remembering a man who trusted in you his whole life through, and we trust in you too. And so, we surrender our hearts, our minds, and our spirits, to the tender touch of your loving presence that heals our wounded hearts.

The prophet Isaiah reminds us, "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand ... For I, the LORD your God, hold your right hand; it is I who say to you, "Fear not, I am the one who helps you" (Isaiah 41:10, 13). In the name of the Risen Lord, Jesus Christ.

P: To you, O blessed Trinity, be glory and honor, forever and ever. In the name of the Father, the Son + and the Holy Spirit.

P: God of all grace, we give you thanks because by his death our Savior Jesus Christ destroyed the power of death and by his resurrection, he opened the kingdom of heaven to all believers. Make us certain that because he lives we shall live also, and that neither death nor life, nor things present nor things to come, will be able to separate us from your love in Christ Jesus our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
