New Journeys

Life is a beautiful journey filled with lessons, hardships, heartaches, joys, celebrations and special moments that will ultimately lead us to our destination, our purpose in life. The road will not always be smooth in fact, throughout our travels, we will encounter many challenges. Some of these challenges will test our courage, strengths, weaknesses, and faith. Along the way, obstacles may come up that cause us to stumble but we trust God will help us figure out how to overcome these obstacles and follow the right path. Sometimes these obstacles are really blessings in disguise, only we don't realize that at the time.¹

The people that we meet on our journey, may be people God sends our way just when we need them. Some may stay for a lifetime; others may only stay for a short while. It is often the people who stay for only a short time that end up making a lasting impression not only in our lives, but in our hearts as well. Although we may not realize it at the time, they will make a difference and change our lives in a way we never could imagine. To think that one person can have such a profound effect on your life forever is truly a blessing. It is because of these encounters that we learn some of life's best lessons and sometimes we even learn a little bit about ourselves.⁴

Our Youth Group chose their own name for how they refer to themselves. 425 Youth Group takes the church's street address and pairs it with scripture: Proverbs 4:25, "*Look straight ahead, and fix your eyes on what lies before you*" (New Living Translation). They chose this guiding scripture to remind them that Jesus Christ walks with them and leads them, that they have chosen to walk in the footsteps of being his disciples with their eyes trained on God. Walking in the way of their faith keeps them on the right road, even when they are uncertain where that road will take them, they trust in the one leading them.

Our lives are a journey rather than a destination. Every choice we make and every action we take has a huge effect on our lives and tends to change the direction of our journey. Life is a journey because as we continue to move through life there is always something new in front of us. There is always a decision for us to make, there is always a choice, and it is up to us to choose the better way and that's when our journey changes its direction.² Along our journey we will be confronted with many situations, some will be filled with joy, and some will be filled with heartache. How we react to what we are faced with determines what kind of outcome the rest of our journey through life will be like.¹

Every choice we make opens a new pathway for us on our road of life. During life's journey we all

make mistakes and no matter how big they are we give them the name “experience.” Those mistakes, or “experiences” offer us the opportunity to learn from them and through learning we grow as individuals. If life is not a journey, why are there different opportunities thrown in front of us? We are meant to take advantage of the time we have; we make choices and mistakes and learn from them so that tomorrow we will be able to make better choices and enjoy life more. ²

Things don't always go our way, and we have two choices in dealing with the situations. We can focus on the fact that things didn't go how we had hoped they would and let life pass us by, or we can make the best out of the situation and know that these are only temporary setbacks and find the lessons that are to be learned.³ New life journeys are a constant navigating and negotiating through uncertainty and at the same time having the courage to take the first step. Staying stuck in the past can keep you from the new thing God wants to do in your life. New journeys rarely come with a map, but they do come with a compass¹, our trust in and relationship with God. We trust and believe that we do not walk alone knowing God is always with us.

Through prayer and reading scripture God reveals how you fit into God's plan and how your story is part of God's story. God is always doing something new in our lives: Isaiah 43:19 is God's Word, “See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?” and Revelation 21:5 “See, I am making all things new.” In 2 Corinthians 5:15,17 the Apostle Paul writes, “¹⁵And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again....¹⁷Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!”

“Paul is saying that, “God has done something new in my life. All that went before, I can let go because now, as I enter into this new experience of God in Jesus, everything becomes new.” Paul goes on: “I just want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection.” He is opening himself to the Spirit, and God is working in new ways now. Paul is ready to be open to that, and God transforms his life. New things really begin to happen, and he can't wait until, as he says, “Forgetting what lies behind and streaming forward to what lies ahead, I press on towards the goal for the prize of the Heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.” Through the Spirit, God has transformed Paul, and Paul, being open to that Spirit, finds himself ready to act in new ways to relate to God.”⁵

We are *Resurrection People* the ones who are focused on God's promises of New Life that were revealed to us through Jesus Christ. Our lives have been and are continually being transformed and empowered by believing in and living as ones who follow Jesus in our daily lives. We are a community acting as the body of Christ on earth, embodying hope, love, and renewal. Walking together to support, love, and serve each other. Living out our baptismal vows by “*proclaiming Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.*”

We should enjoy life and take advantage of every moment we have. We know life has two defined endpoints, the beginning and the end. What matters is the living we do in between them. By living in today, the present, the *now*, we are able to notice and appreciate all the things we have in our lives and look forward with joy and excitement to what comes next. Every second counts and because life is a journey, every second can teach us a lesson that adds an enriching experience and personal growth to our journey. "*Your journey never ends. Life has a way of changing things in incredible ways.*"²

May the LORD bless all your new journeys and the path you walk.

Speaking of “*New Things*”...The Worship & Music Committee has recommended to the Church Council that we try an experiment during the summer months and it was approved.

This experiment will be reducing the size of our worship bulletins by using the hymnals for the worship liturgy as well as the hymns and service music. At this time, we only have a limited number (50) of the newest hymnals (2006), the Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) cranberry hymnals. Part of this experiment is deciding if we should invest in purchasing more of these. During worship we will be using either the green hymnals, Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW, 1978) or the cranberry hymnals, depending on the liturgy for that day. You will not have to negotiate using two hymnals in one service. The Worship & Music Committee is still working out the process for reintegrating the hymnals into our worship.

We will continue to offer a limited number of large print, comprehensive bulletins for those who need them and to be sent to the care homes. This will take some getting used to as any change does, and your feedback during this experiment is welcomed.

The worship weekend of June 6 & 7, 2026 is the targeted “begin date” for this experiment and we will continue it through the summer months.

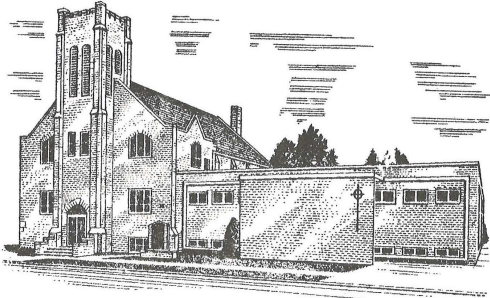
