Activity 1: BUILDING BABEL

The Bible says the whole world had one language. That means people could all understand one another when they spoke. After people moved eastward to Babel and settled down, they decided to build a tower to show off and to bring them recognition - they tried to make themselves look more important than God.

Materials:

- Brick sheet (included)
- Spiral scripture sheet (included)
- Tape
- Scissors

Instructions:

- Make a cone out of the brick sheet secure with tape
- · Cut across the wide end of the cone so the cone will stand on a table
- Cut the spiral scripture and place over cone to make a ramp to the top secure with tape at both ends

- When you are traveling with your family, read a verse at each red light, or when you see a
 certain animal, or when you pass by the church, or other times you agree on!

Faithfulness: Continuing to believe in God, whether in good times or bad.


Gentleness: Also translated as "meekness", which is not weakness! The opposites of gentleness are anger and a desire for revenge.


